
Te Wera programme at Hāwera High School

The Te Wera is designed to focus on the following 8 values in the New Zealand Curriculum.


The 'Exponential Age' and 21st Century Learning

Who is teaching this class?

Hāwera High School has passionate and enthusiastic teachers and from this pool, teachers have been selected who are capable of teaching over a range of learning areas to form the Te Wera team.

How long does the programme last?

Students have the option to continue with the Te Wera programme in Year 10.

What about option subjects?

Students will spend 15 hours out of 25 each week in the Te Wera programme. For the remainder of the time they will rotate through option subjects (Technology and Arts) as well as learning Te reo me ona tikanga (Māori language and customs) and Hauora classes (Health and Physical Education) to cover the remainder of the curriculum.

How does this link to NCEA?

This course is specifically designed to support the skills required to attain Excellence in NCEA. How will students be assessed?

Students will be assessed against the same curriculum objectives, however, the assessment method will be more holistic.
